Regional Opportunities:

CHC Foundation: CHC Foundation serves 10 counties: Bonneville, Northern Bingham, Butte, Clark, Eastern Custer, Fremont, Jefferson, Madison, Lemhi, and Teton. Grant seekers must have a tax-exempt status (501(c)(3)). Cities, counties and school districts are eligible within the service area. Click Here Deadline: Spring and Fall applications

The Development Company: This organization covers many counties in Eastern Idaho, contact Rick Miller to determine if your county qualifies. Assists communities in updating their development needs. Click Here

Community Development Block Grant: Assists cities and counties in Idaho with public infrastructure. ICDBG is very willing to receiving applications from entities seeking park grants, however, not every park project will fit into their program. Their grant has a maximum amount of \$150,000, so it is worth considering. The counties that they serve are Bonneville, Jefferson, Madison, Teton, Fremont, Clark, Custer, Lemhi and Butte. Click Here

Deadline: Applications due Friday before Thanksgiving.

Rocky Mountain Power Grants: As the philanthropic arm of Rocky Mountain Power, the Foundation of the same name serves the growth and vitality of communities in Utah, Wyoming, and Southeastern Idaho. The Foundation limits it grants to charitable organizations with 501(c)3 tax exemption status, but eligibility is further restricted to programs listed below:

- Educational and research organizations both public and private, from early childhood through university level (proposals due March 15)
- Environment, civic and community enhancement and other organizations not covered in other categories (due June 15)
- Arts and culture organizations dedicated to performing arts, visual arts, historic preservation, cross-cultural education and related (due September 15)
- Health, safety and wellness organizations including youth organizations, senior citizen centers, dependency and prevention programs and related (due December 15)

Deadline: Varies, see above Amount: \$2,000-\$5,000

State-Wide:

Walmart Community Programs: Walmart Foundation's key areas of focus, <u>Sustainability</u> are <u>Opportunity</u> and <u>Community</u>. Through the Community Grant Program, Walmart supports the needs of their communities by providing grants to local organizations. Look at their eligibility guide.

Idaho Community Foundation Regional Competitive Grant: There are a variety of grants available depending on the region of the state you are located in. Grant deadlines also vary by region - Northern Region (deadline Feb 15); Eastern Region (deadline June 15); Southwest Region (deadline August 15) All grant seekers must be either government entities – public educational institutions, or have a tax exempt status (501(c)(3)). Fred Meyer Fund: The Fred Meyer Fund awards grants to nonprofit organizations in Alaska, Idaho, Oregon and Washington with focus areas in Youth Development/K-12 Education Grants for support programs and organizations that help youth build character, increase self esteem, develop leadership and social skills and participate in constructive life experiences. Bank of the West's Charitable Investments Program: This program is limited to public, nonprofit charitable 501(c)(3) organizations/agencies, with special consideration for projects serving low to moderate income individuals and communities. Visit their website to see if your county is served. Click Here

National Opportunities:

American Express: One of the three divisions of American Express grant program includes community service which could be a good fit for playground installations. Check out their website to learn more about projects that have been funded, initiatives and how to apply.

Aetna Foundation Obesity Prevention Grant Program: The Aetna Foundation want to learn more about the underlying causes of obesity so they can inform and shape effective health and wellness programs. They want to understand the causes that contribute to obesity, particularly among minority populations, and how to support and sustain better choices in order to prevent overeating and reduce inactivity.
